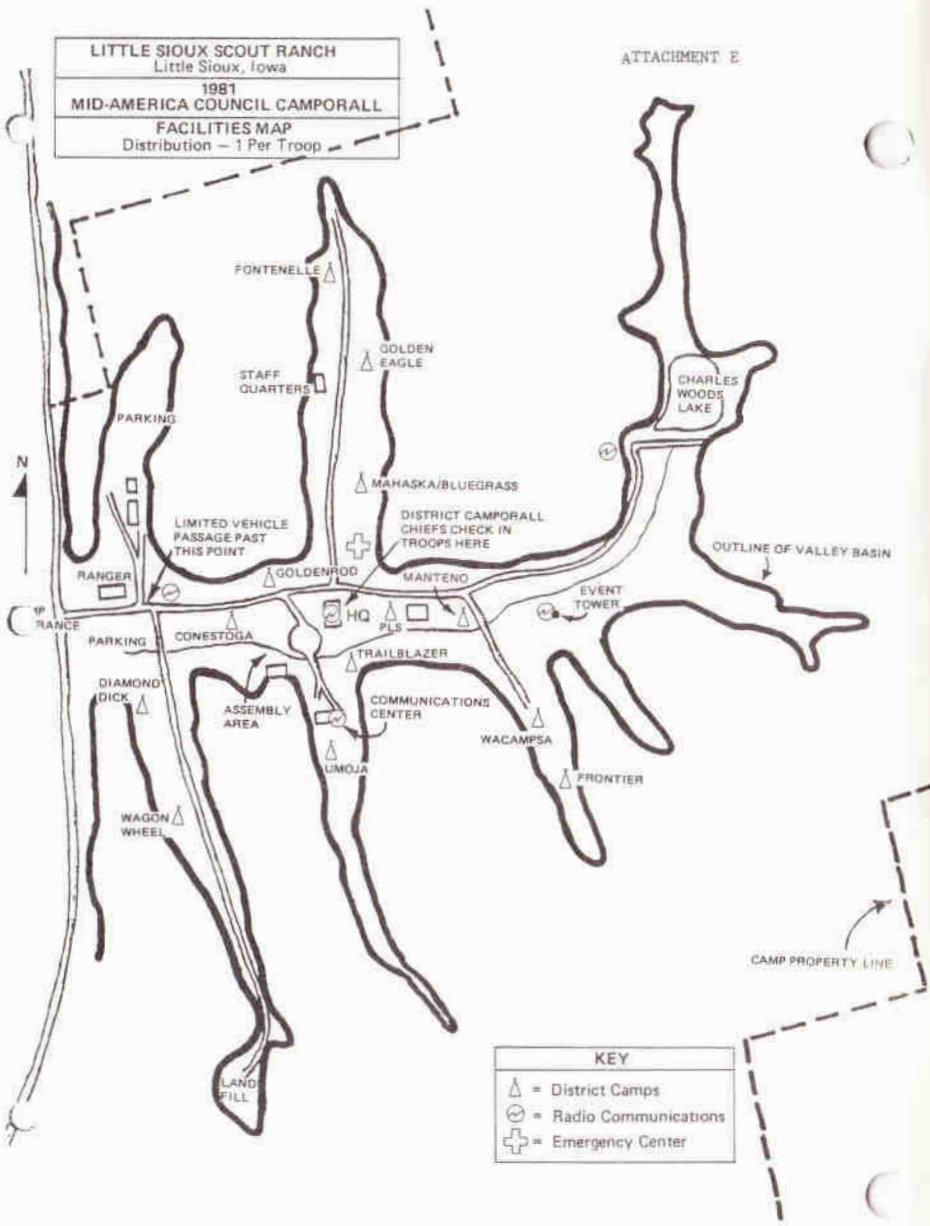

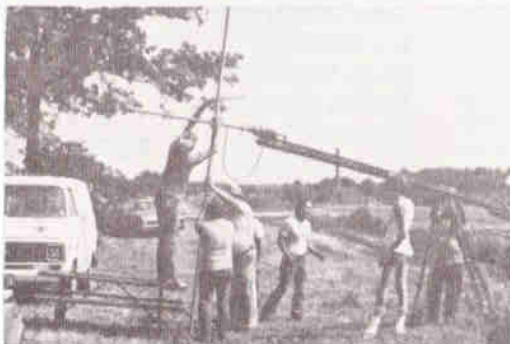
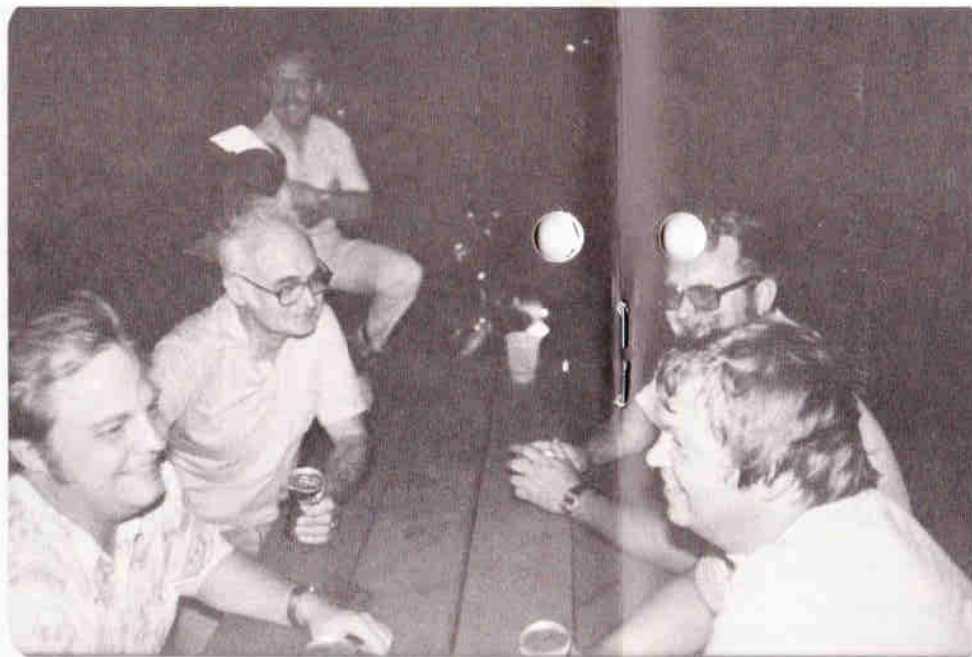

The meeting was called to order at 19:30 hours by President Jim Wilson, WBØJPN, and began with the Pledge of Allegiance.

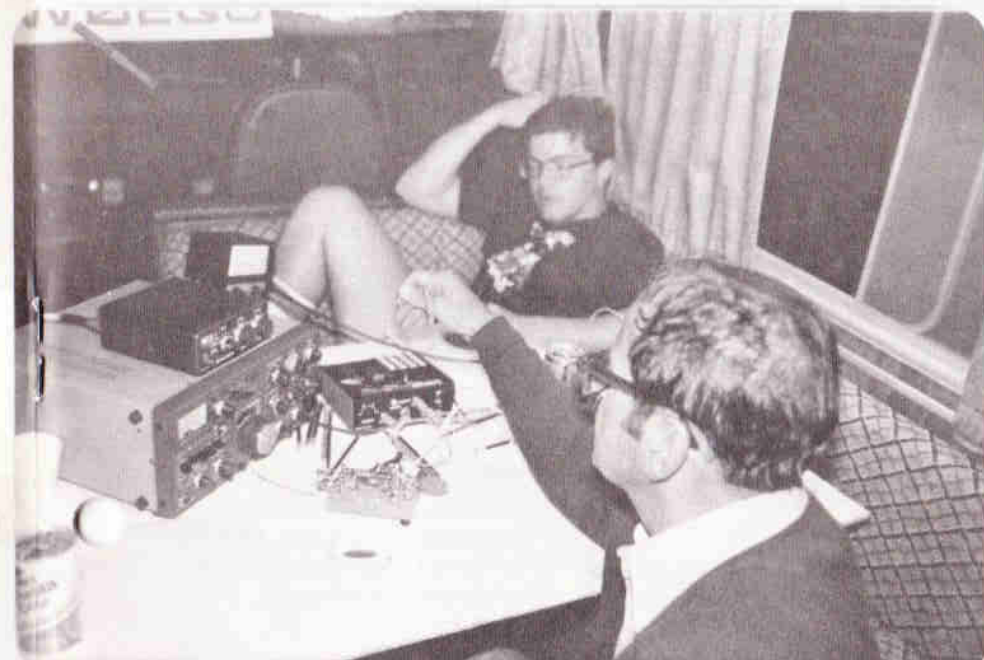
Identification — each member arose and gave their name and call.

Dave also has been quite interested in providing many of the pictures in Ham Hum over the past few years and our many thanks go to him.

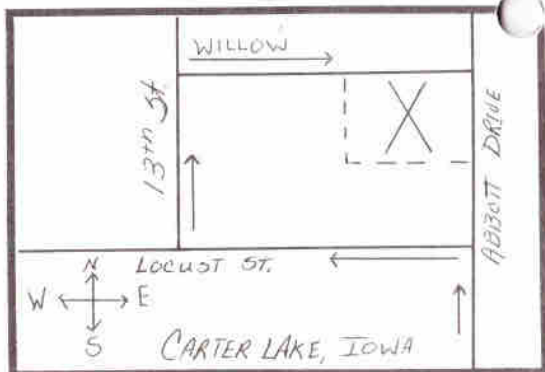
