



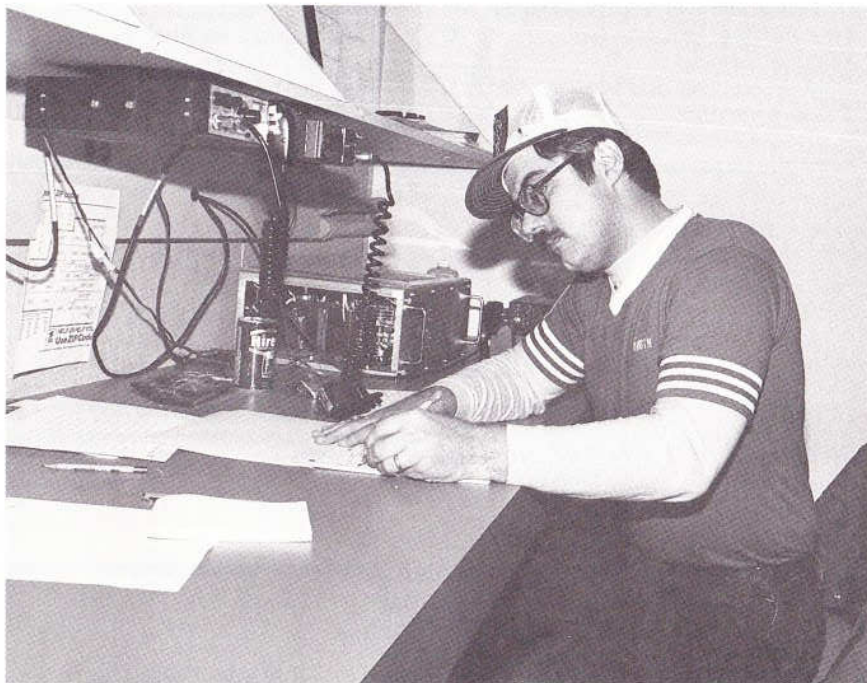

The 1983 Simulated Emergency Test was held on October 16, 1983. Approximately 50 Hams from the following areas participated: Red Oak, IA; Hastings, IA; Griswold, IA; Council Bluffs, IA; Cedar Bluffs, IA; Blair NE; Omaha, NE; Herman, NE; Lincoln, NE.

The National WX Service in Omaha went to generator power for this exercise. Also, 146.40/00 switched to battery back-up.

Ten messages were sent/received, including one to the State Civil Defense EOC, c/o Les Meyers KØSCM, the Communications Officer for the State. A full report will be forwarded to the League by NØAIH, Nebraska Section Emergency Coordinator.

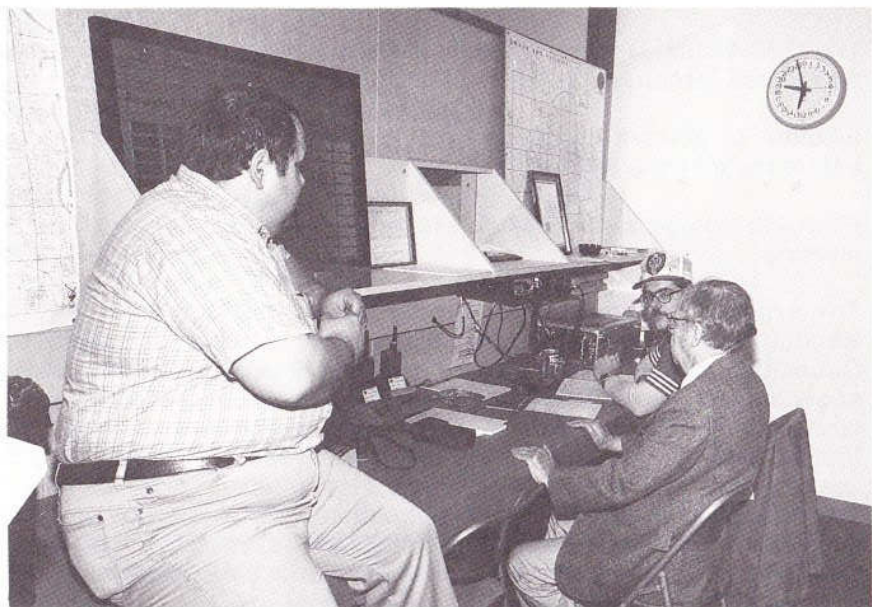

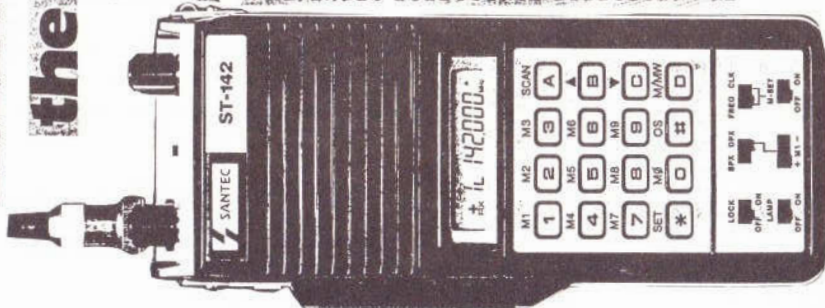
