It was windy during the installation, on Sunday, 31 Jul 2016, about 30 knots on the ground and 50 up on the tower.





The left picture you can see the elevator that was used to bring up the new and take down the old antenna. The jumper to the old antenna from the hard line wasn't in too good a shape and it has been eliminated. It had water in it with some corrosion. The hard line is now connected directly to the antenna with no jumper and UHF connector that was on the old one eliminated. Joe checked all the rest of the antenna lines and splitter and found them in good shape. The old antenna appears to have had a lightning strike as well. Nice little weld bead on the top so probably a trailer rather than a direct hit. With the elimination of the jumper, splice and UHF connector we probably got a couple more dBs less loss. And the mad button pusher who never IDs is not as noisy any more.

The picture on the right shows the platform where the antenna is located about 700 feet up, and as mentioned the wind up there was estimated at 50 knots.
