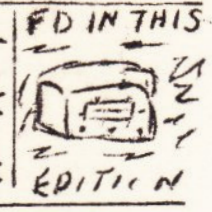
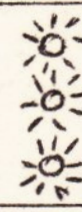

This year the ARRL will be holding its fifteenth annual Field Day and our club will be participating. We will be operating on ten and seventy five from one tent and separately on twenty cw., twenty phone and forty cw. There will be a two meter link into town.

Free coffee will be served to all ops at all hours.

It is requested that everyone bring their own yellow light globe and their own cot.

The FD site, the top of a hill covered with grass and just the right number of oak is only a total of 2.7 miles from the city limits. From the north end of 30th Street turn right on US Highway 73 and drive 2.3 miles northwest passing the Forget Store. A short distance past the store on the north side of the road there will be a large sign with the red FD and an arrow. Turn here and drive North for .4 miles to the next sign and you are there.

The property owner has requested that there be no open fires. However, if you have a charcoal burner or similar device please contact John Orr.

Due to the fact that we must pass by the owners home in getting to the site all unnecessary driving must be eliminated. Cars will be parked near the road at which point there will be located a telephone in the actual site. Transportation will be supplied for equipment.

Also we must try to avoid any contact with the surrounding neighbors.

With common courtesy extended by us we will be able to use the location again next year.


