ARRL recommends and urges that all U.S. and Canadian amateurs voluntarily avoid any use of the 14335 to 14350 KC frequencies to permit better DX for all concerned. It should let amateurs in other countries work U.S. and each other with optimum success. The high end frequencies get more SSB use, those at the top end for DX should strengthen this traditional pattern of use and benefit for all. There will be more in July QST on reserving the high end of 20 for SSB DX. All amateurs are requested to put this plan into effect immediately and it is suggested all amateurs outside W/VE land answer only calls from W/VEs working below 14335 KC. AR

Amateurs are again reminded to beware of the radiation of harmonics from amateur stations in frequency ranges outside the amateur bands. ARRL Official Observers continue to send out reports in an effort to keep amateurs out of difficulty with the FCC. Amateurs, especially those newly licensed, are urged to make sure their transmitters and antennas are radiating at the desired output frequency rather than at a harmonic. All are requested to help the new licensee in this respect. Refer to Chapter 23 of the Handbook for eliminating harmonics AR
